## **Forward Planning Your Irrigation Project**


I see it all too often, customers who wait to move forward only to have things delayed by well drillers schedules and product delivery, and we all know what that's like nowadays.

# A History of Irrigation Services to Farmers

Forty-seven years ago, or so, an irrigation company began south of Lakeview, Michigan, 5.5 miles south of town, just down the road from 5 Corners. A dedicated irrigation professional from Romeo Michigan named Ken Tank moved to the area to serve a growing number of mainly potato farmers that were irrigating their crops with a variety of methods from solid set pipe with sprinklers, to wheel lines and traveling guns. Ken worked for Sprinkler Irrigation Supply Co. (SISCO for short) based out of Royal Oak Michigan. Ken peddled parts from his living room and used an old semi-trailer for storage. As the business grew Ken soon built a small 28x32 pole building which was the basis of what would become Farm Services Inc.

As center pivot irrigation became more prevalent in the area, the branch became a Reinke Irrigation systems dealer. Reinke was the FIRST, bowstring truss, electric drive reversible system on the market. As more systems were installed, Ken needed help with erection and service. A no-nonsense farmhand named Dan Abbott came on board, and at the same time brought his custom grain harvest operation into the mix. A few years after that, the two partnered together, purchasing the branch from SISCO and beginning Farm Services Inc. in 1981. As the business grew, the need for more employees was always there. In 1985 Jason Preston started as a build crew member. As time went on, Jason took on more of the role of doing the service work required to keep up with the ever-expanding improvements and technology that was being implemented in the center pivot business.

With the passing of Ken in 1995, Dan moved to the sole ownership role at FSI, and Jason soon progressed to sales while still managing the build crew daily as well as service work along with some dedicated employees. In 2001, Jason became a partner in FSI. The business steadily grew until 2010 when Dan sold his interest to Jason and new partners, Todd & Tim Young. After several years of rapid growth, Tim exited the partnership at the end of 2018. Jason and Todd moved forward as sole shareholders.

During this growth period, the new partnership ended the custom harvest division of the business after the 2014 season to focus solely on becoming the best agriculture irrigation provider in central and northern Michigan serving growers from the I-96 corridor all the way to the Mackinac bridge.
